## FINGERPRINT CLEARANCE: CONSEQUENCES OF DUI PROSECUTION & CONVICTION

## **REAPPLICATION & DISCIPLINE**

- Applications and reapplications for clearances may be denied for arrest or conviction of certain enumerated offenses.<sup>2</sup> Clearances may be <u>suspended or revoked</u> if arrested/convicted of certain enumerated offenses.
- If DUI arrest/conviction, receive 5 year restriction that cannot be removed by a good cause showing
