<u>Crime Involving Moral Turpitude</u>: class of crime that may have immigration consequences. Usually, *Malum in se*.

<u>Inadmissibility</u>: alien barred from entering the U.S. or obtaining a new immigration benefit if present \*\*\*

<u>Deportable</u>: alien lawfully present in the U.S. may be deported \*\*\*

Adjustment of Status: alien lawfully entered U.S. as non-immigrant, applies to become lawful permanent

resident (or other lawful status) without leaving the U.S. \*\*
